More than 150 college students marched on the State Capitol today to protest proposed cuts to higher education. There were students representing all four college systems, and they were carrying signs that read "No Funds, No Future," "No Cuts," and "Katrina Didn't Close UNO But the Cuts Can." Last week in Shreveport, higher education leaders, legislators, and business leaders from NWLA joined to talk about possible solutions to the impending higher education funding crisis. Legislators seemed united in both their concern and commitment to finding a solution that would protect higher ed. State Representative Mike Johnson told the crowd, "I am very optimistic that we are going to solve this thing. - Governor Bobby Jindal's address to the legislature on Monday appears to have provided little encouragement to legislators, with most telling Tyler Bridges of the Advocate they "don't expect much help." State Representative Brett Geymann said, "The administration is not giving us the details and support we need." *[The Advocate, 04.15.15](#)*
- The LSU System has created a website called the LSU Budget Hub that lists bills they are supporting this session. The bills are either centered around securing stable funding or granting more autonomy. Shreveport's Thomas Carmody is the author of two bills on the list. *[LSU Budget Hub, 04.15](#)*
- Legislators have begun reviewing bills this session and are finding there are many more than usual designed to raise revenue. House Speaker Chuck Kleckley said, "It shows the interest from the membership, across party lines, to find ways to balance the budget and minimize cuts to higher education and health care." *[The Advocate, 04.13.15](#)*

- The US Department of Education has fined Corinthian Colleges \$30 million and told them it is now time to close their colleges in the Heald College chain. "Corinthian violated students' and taxpayers' trust.
