The first major TOPS bill to land on the Governor's desk is expected to be signed right away. Senate Bill 154, which was sponsored by Senator Jack Donahue, would no longer have TOPS payments automatically increase alongside college tuition increases. The TOPS program currently serves more than 50,000 students and will cost the state about \$300 million this year.

- While Governor Edwards is pushing for a special session in early summer to help close the \$600 million budget deficit, the powerful business lobbying group LABI is arguing we should wait until later next year when we know how much revenue has come in from new taxes.
